To Kill a Mockingbird Film

- 1. **Setting**: How is the setting the same or different? Explain.
 - a. What are some things about the setting that suggest that the film takes place in the 1930s?
 - b. What settings were not featured in the film? How did you picture them?
 - c. What is the placement of one house compared to another? (ex: Did you think the Radley home would be closer or further away? Does it matter?)
 - d. Are there any clues that tell us what country or state the story takes place in?
- 2. **Events**: What is similar or different in the plot? Why would these changes have been made?
 - a. List all the events that are different: Other than to make the film shorter, why else would these scenes have been eliminated?
 - b. List all the scenes that happened just as described. Were these scenes more important than those that were left out?
 - c. Are there any scenes added that are not in the book?
- 3. **Acting**: Is there anything different about a character in the film versus the book? What is something about the character's appearance, actions, dialogue, etc. that you did not expect?
 - a. Atticus
 - i. Did he have a better relationship with the kids in the book or movie?
 - ii. Was his ability as a lawyer better highlighted in the book or the movie?
 - b. Scout
 - i. What is Scout's personality in the book versus the movie?
 - ii. Which Scout is better developed?
 - c. Jem
 - i. Do we see Jem develop more in the book or movie? Explain.
 - ii. Does Jem's relationship with Scout change in the movie?
 - d. Dill
 - i. Is Dill a negative influence on Jem in the movie?
 - ii. Do we see any development in Dill in the movie?
 - e. Tom Robinson
 - i. Is Tom's honesty and innocence more obvious in the book or the movie? Explain.
 - f. Mayella Ewell
 - g. Bob Ewell
 - h. Miss Maudie, Judge Taylor, Aunt Alexandra, Mrs. Dubose, Mr. Raymond, Link Deas, Ms. Rachel, and Ms. Stephanie Crawford
- 4. **Sounds**: Voices, sounds, etc. What is something you noticed about the voices, speech, music, etc.? Does the sound better the experience?
 - a. Is there a difference in the accents of actors? What does it tell us about them?
 - b. Does the background score add any layers to the story?
 - c. There are many silent moments; how do they add to the intensity of the story? Give examples.
- 5. **Pacing**: Is the pacing of the movie better or worse than the story? Do the things they include/exclude make the film better?
 - a. There are many scenes/characters/etc. not present in the movie: Does that make the movie faster? Does it make it more confusing? Explain.
 - b. Do certain scenes have more/less screen time than needed? Explain.
 - c. Should the movie have been longer?
 - d. What one scene/character that was cut should definitely have been included?
 - e. Was the order of scenes changed? Did it make the film better?
